




### CNA Growth Trends



In 2014, there were 124,616 active Certified Nurse Aides (CNA) providing care in Texas.


- This number represents a 2.5% increase since 2009 and a 12.3% increase since 2004.

- Only 1.8% of the CNA workforce were currently eligible for retirement
- Within ten years, 11.5% of the current CNA workforce will be at or past retirement age.
- 58.8% of the CNA workforce in 2014 was under 40 years of age.

### Geographic Distribution of CNA

CNAs were not evenly distributed throughout the state.

- There was a 59.1% difference between the number of CNAs in metropolitan and non-metropolitan areas even after controlling for population differences.
- Between border and non-border areas the percent difference was 12.2%.
