- Health Care Providers must report all overdoses from substances listed in the Penalty Group 1. An overdose is defined as a Penalty Group 1 drug effect, direct or indirect, resulting in an adverse health event.
- Penalty 1 drugs include: Any **OPIATE/OPIOD** NOT in combination with a non-narcotic analgesic (i.e. **NOT** Percodan, Lortab, Vicofen, etc.) **COCAINE, LSD, PCP, Designer AMPHETAMINES** (i.e. XTC, Crystal meth, etc.), **ROHYPNOL** (but **NOT** other Benzodiazepines and **GHB** ( and it's precursors).
