



The Adult Safety Net (ASN) Program supplies publicly-purchased vaccine at no cost to enrolled providers. The Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) Immunization Branch created the Adult Safety Net Program to increase access to vaccination services in Texas for uninsured adults, thereby raising the immunization coverage levels and improving the health of Texans. Unvaccinated adults are at an increased risk of developing and spreading vaccine-preventable diseases.

Why should I enroll?

Your participation in the ASN Program would help address low adult vaccination rates by providing access to important vaccines. The Immunization Branch provides ASN vaccines to enrolled providers at no cost for administration to eligible adults (19 years of age and older) without health insurance. Enrolled providers may charge an administration fee of up to \$25 for each vaccine administered. However, providers may not deny vaccine administration due to a patient’s inability to pay. Joining the ASN Program is beneficial to your business as well as to improving the health of Texans.
