

Youth Empowerment Services (YES) Waiver Provider Network Development Report

The LMHA must make a good faith effort to assess the availability of providers and develop a plan for network development. If interested providers are identified the LMHA must enter into a subcontracting relationship to provide the following services:

1. Adaptive Aids and Supports
2. Community Living Supports
3. Employment Assistance
4. Family Supports
5. Minor Home Modifications
6. Non-Medical Transportation
7. Paraprofessional Services
8. Respite Services
9. Specialized Therapies
10. Supported Employment
11. Supportive Family Based Alternatives
12. Transitional Services

If the LMHA is unable to enter into a contract with a provider, the LMHA must document efforts made to contract with providers, and make such documentation available to DSHS upon request.

On the following page is a sample report that you can utilize to report on the provider network development and maintenance activities you have completed during the contract year.

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List the provider network development and maintenance activities you have completed during the contract year.

- Documentation of all provider outreach and recruitment efforts and due diligence in establishing and maintaining network adequacy. This includes good faith efforts to assess the availability of providers and enter into a subcontracting relationship with providers, if interested, to provide the YES service array.
- Evidence of new and creative approaches to recruit and retain an adequate provider network.
- Marketing to potential providers including invitation of competition from new qualified providers.
