Hint Sheet

Reminders for Surveyor's

1. Please count 1 lb, 2 lb and 5 lb bags of carrots and mark lowest price.
2. Please remember to look at the top of shelves for items as well. These are **not** considered items to be stocked at a later time but rather they are items that are readily available and present for a customer to purchase. Items on top shelves usually occur in the cereal and bread aisles of the store. Do not count items on the top shelf if they are in their shipping boxes, where a customer would have to pull the box down and open it. This would not likely happen in a store and therefore should not be counted.
3. When measuring the LEB in frozen fruit juices ensure you are in fact looking at the cheapest price in that flavor even though it may have a WIC sticker. If you do find that the WIC sticker is not on the lowest price, please make notes at the bottom of the page.
4. In addition, be aware that some of the orange juices and purple and white grape juices are COCKTAILS and NOT actually 100% juice.
5. Some stores may have ice chest type silver containers that contain among other things, fresh hot white corn tortillas. Please ensure you look in those types of containers to ensure you do not miss items.
6. One recommendation is to obtain all your measurements, prices, and weights, for items that need calculations and perform those calculations outside the store. Do not drive off, but rather make the calculations in the parking lot, so you spend less time in the store and out of people's way.
