RE: Elimination of PERS Registration Requirements

Effective September 1, 2015, Personal Emergency Response System operator, as defined in the Health and Safety Code Chapter 781, will no longer be required to hold registrations issued by the Department of State Health Services (DSHS) in order to conduct business in the state. These recent changes were the result of amendments enacted by Senate Bill (SB) 202, passed during the 84th Texas Legislature, Regular Session (2015). SB 202 repealed HSC, Chapter 781.

- The certificate you are required to hold to operate as a Personal Emergency Response System operator will expire on August 31, 2015.
- After that date, DSHS will no longer issue new licenses/registrations, and **no DSHS license/registration will be required** for this profession.
- Licenses due to expire have been automatically extended to a new expiration date of August 31, 2015.
- Please note that there may be state and federal laws with which you must still comply.

Please do not post your certificate for public viewing on and after September 1, 2015, as it will no longer be valid. You should also refrain from advertising or making references in connection with your business that would lead the public to believe that you still hold a license issued by DSHS as a Personal Emergency Response System operator.
