


# Selected Cancer Facts - Brazoria County - 2009







## Leading Three Sites, Childhood and Adolescent Cancer (0-19 years), 1997–2006

Leukemias (ICCC-3 Group I)*	28	22%
Central nervous system neoplasms (ICCC-3 Group III)*	24	19%
Germ cell neoplasms (ICCC-3 Group X)*	17	13%
All Other Groups	58	46%

Labels are abbreviated as follows: Group I includes myeloproliferative disease and myelodysplastic diseases; Group II includes reticuloendothelial neoplasms; Group III includes miscellaneous intracranial and intraspinal neoplasms; Group X includes trophoblastic tumors and neoplasms of gonads.
