


# Selected Cancer Facts - Dallas County - 2009






Dallas County

## Leading Three Sites, Childhood and Adolescent Cancer (0-19 years), 1997–2006

Leukemias (ICCC-3 Group I)*	335	29%
Central nervous system neoplasms (ICC-3 Group III)*	209	18%
Lymphomas (ICCC-3 Group II)*	174	15%
All Other Groups	444	38%

\*ICCC-3 - International Classification of Childhood Cancer. Labels are abbreviated as follows: Group I includes myeloproliferative disease and myelodysplastic diseases; Group II includes reticuloendothelial neoplasms; Group III includes miscellaneous intracranial and intraspinal neoplasms.
