


# Selected Cancer Facts - Grayson County - 2009






Grayson County

## Leading Three Sites, Childhood and Adolescent Cancer (0-19 years), 1997–2006

Childhood Cancer Site Group	N	Percent of Total
All childhood and adolescent cancer groups combined	60	100%
Central nervous system neoplasms (ICC-3 Group III)*	14	23%
Leukemias (ICCC-3 Group I)*	12	20%
Lymphomas (ICCC-3 Group II)*	9	15%
All Other Groups	25	42%

\*ICCC-3 - International Classification of Childhood Cancer. Labels are abbreviated as follows: Group I includes myeloproliferative disease and myelodysplastic diseases; Group II includes reticuloendothelial neoplasms; Group III includes miscellaneous intracranial and intraspinal neoplasms.
