


Selected Cancer Facts - Williamson County - 2009







In 2009, it is estimated that there will be 1,537 new cancer cancer cases and 565 cancer deaths in Williamson County.

Leukemias (ICCC-3 Group I)*	50	30%
Central nervous system neoplasms (ICCC-3 Group III)*	35	21%
Lymphomas (ICCC-3 Group II)*	23	14%
All Other Groups	57	35%

*ICCC-3 - International Classification of Childhood Cancer. Labels are abbreviated as follows: Group I includes myeloproliferative disease and myelodysplastic diseases; Group II includes reticuloendothelial neoplasms; Group III includes miscellaneous intracranial and intraspinal neoplasms.
