## 2016 Summary Report of SHS Ordinance Activity in Texas



TX population covered by smoke-free restaurants	64.6%
TX population covered by smoke-free bars in restaurants	60.0%
TX population covered by smoke-free bars not in restaurants	49.5%

#/% cities with smoke-free bars not in restaurants	57/290: 20%


## Percentage of the Texas Municipal Population Protected by 100% Smoke-Free Ordinances in all Five Settings\*


## Percentage of the Texas Municipal Population Protected by 100% Smoke-Free Ordinances in Three or More Settings\*
