




Data Sources:

Demographics: Texas State Data Center, Population Estimates and Projection Program.

Prevalence: Texas Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System, 2010. Definitions: a.) CVD - % of respondents 18 years and older who reported ever having been diagnosed as having had a heart attack, myocardial infarction, angina, coronary heart disease, or stroke; b.) Heart Disease - % of respondents 18 years and older who reported ever having been diagnosed as having had a heart attack, myocardial infarction, angina, coronary heart disease; c.) Stroke - % of respondents 18 years and older who reported ever having been diagnosed as having had a stroke.

Mortality: Texas Vital Statistics Unit. 2009 preliminary mortality due to CVD (ICD-10 Code I00-I99); heart disease (ICD-10 Code I00-I09, I11, I13, I20-I51); stroke (ICD-10 Code I60-I69).

'/' indicates that the sample size was too small to be considered statistically valid (< 50 respondents for prevalence, < 12 deaths for mortality rates).

Note: Prevalence values appearing in bold denote the state has a significantly different prevalence (than U.S.).
