



Case Management for Children and Pregnant Women is a Medicaid benefit that provides health-related case management services to children birth through 20 years of age with a health condition and to high-risk pregnant women of any age. Case managers help clients gain access to needed medical, social, educational, and other services.

Who can become a case manager?

Physician offices, schools, health departments, counseling agencies, health clinics, and other types of agencies that employ licensed social workers or RNs can provide case management services. Case managers may also be licensed social workers or RNs working as individuals. Interested social workers and nurses must meet all eligibility requirements.



Individuals and agencies must apply with the Department of State Health Services and enroll with Medicaid.

Case managers will receive reimbursement for an assessment/service plan development and follow-up contacts. Reimbursement is

- \$146.16 for comprehensive visit
- \$122.31 for follow-up contact
- \$ 29.36 for telephone follow-up contact
