
Trends, Distribution, and Demographics

Licensed Professional Counselors







In 2014, there were 20,655 actively licensed professional counselors (LPC) providing direct patient care in Texas.

- This number represented a 38.8% increase since 2009 and a 93% increase since 2004.
- Relative to population growth, the size of the LPC workforce has improved by 37.4% over the past ten years.


Despite these improvements, Texas still had fewer licensed professional counselors than the national average.

Ratio of Texas Population to LPC, by Geographic Designation

Licensed professional counselors were not evenly distributed throughout the state.

- There was a 172% difference between the number of LPCs in metropolitan and non-metropolitan areas even after controlling for population differences.
- Between border and non-border areas the percent difference was 178.8%.

13.9% of the LPC workforce are currently greater than 65 years of age and, within ten years, 35.4% of the Texas LPC workforce will be at or past retirement age.

- 10.9% of active LPCs were 61-65 years of age.
- 33.6% of LPCs were aged 40 years or younger.
