


Licensed Vocational Nurses

In 2015, there were 79,154 active Licensed Vocational Nurses (LVNs) in Texas.


- This number represented a 11.3% increase since 2010 and a 28.5% increase since 2004.
- Texas has more LVNs than the national average.



The race/ethnicity¹ of LVNs in 2015 differed from the overall Texas population.


- Whites/Caucasian LVNs were over-represented when compared to the overall population.
- Hispanic/Latinos made up 40.0% of the Texas population, but were under-represented in the LVN workforce.

- There was a 53.5% difference between the number of LVNs in metropolitan areas and non-metropolitan areas.
- There was only a 8.0% difference between the number of LVNs in border areas and non-border areas.



The LVN workforce was young and mostly female, with 40.3% of those holding active licenses under the age of 45 years old and 88.6% female.


- Only 33.5% of active LVNs in Texas will be at or over retirement age in ten years.
- The active male LVN workforce has increased over the past ten years.
