

Texas Heart Attack and Stroke Data Collection Initiative

How to Participate

All hospitals are encouraged to participate in the Texas Department of State Health Services' (DSHS) Texas Heart Attack and Stroke Data Collection Initiative. All data received by DSHS is **de-identified** and, when submitted via RAC, **aggregated**. While 100% participation is the goal, hospital participation is *voluntary*. DSHS uses hospital, and pre-hospital, de-identified data to conduct a needs assessment/gap analysis and works with communities to improve care for heart attack and stroke patients in Texas. **Individual hospitals' data is never identified.**
