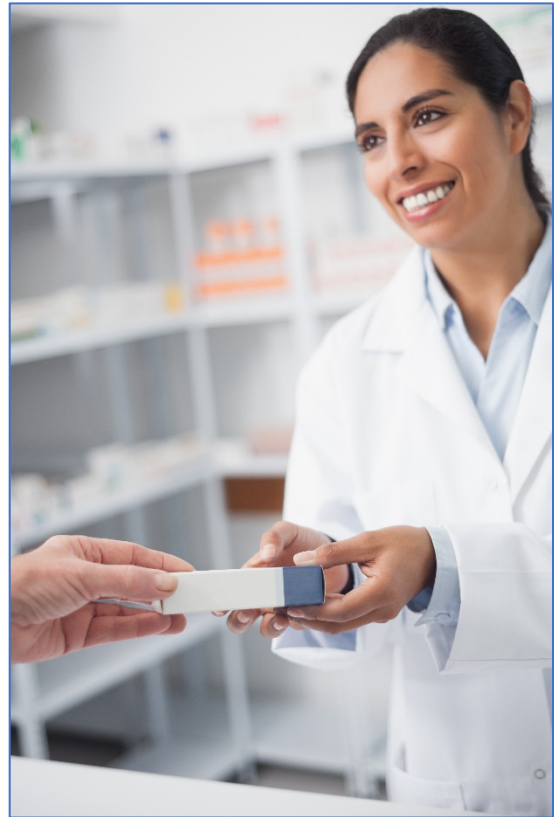

Diabetes Prevention and Control Program

General Information

The Texas Department of State Health Services Diabetes Prevention and Control Program (DPCP), oversees federal and state programs in Texas that focus on diabetes education for the public and professionals.



The goals of DPCP are to:

- Prevent Type 2 diabetes in persons at high risk for developing diabetes.
- Prevent or delay the onset of Type 2 diabetes in persons with prediabetes, gestational diabetes and other risk factors.
- Prevent or delay complications in persons with diabetes.
- Assist persons who have diabetes in managing the disease and the complications that result if untreated.

To achieve these goals, DPCP:

- Administers grant-funded initiatives and contracted services.
- Provides technical assistance to community-based diabetes prevention and self-management programs.
- Disseminates educational materials to the public and health care providers.

DPCP receives funding through the Texas' general revenue fund and federal funding through a cooperative agreement with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The program collaborates with other state agency programs, when possible, to leverage resources and submit coordinated proposals for federal funding opportunities.
