Crafting Your Infection Prevention Future: Strategies for Career Advancement in Infection Prevention

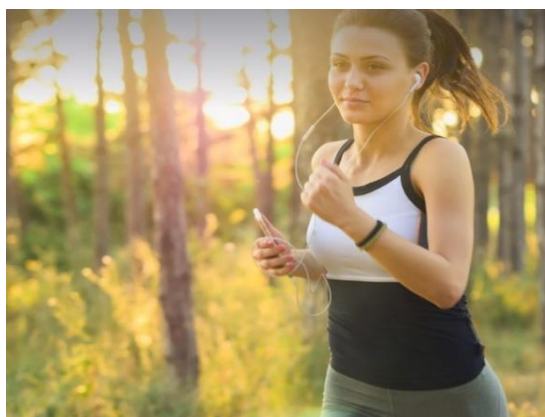

Preventable Adverse Events

The internal data review report for preventable adverse events and healthcare-associated infections (HAIs) for January-June 2025 will be available for preliminary review by general hospitals and ambulatory surgical centers from September 15-30, 2025. Designated contacts at these facilities will be notified to log into the Texas Healthcare Safety Network (TxHSN) to review the data and submit corrections by September 30, 2025. Final facility-specific healthcare safety reports for the January-June 2025 data will be available in the TxHSN from October 15-31, 2025, for facility review before DSHS publishes the reports in December 2025.

Project Firstline Water Micro-Learn Training Resources



Knowing the risk of infections associated with water in healthcare settings is important for patient and resident safety. To increase awareness, CDC's Project Firstline created four water-focused [Infection Control Micro-Learns](#). These resources provide healthcare workers with the knowledge to know when and how water can spread germs and what actions they can take to reduce this risk. Each micro-learn connects infection control concepts to immediate, practical value. CDC recommends using micro-learns as a guide for infection control discussions, facilitating

conversations between groups of healthcare workers (e.g., pre-shift huddles, team meetings), led by a team member with infection control expertise.

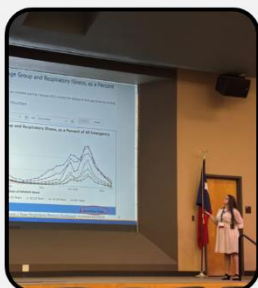
