ANNUAL SUMMARY OF MORBIDITY REPORTS FOR 1979

The final official figures on the reported incidence of notifiable diseases in 1979 are presented in this report. The actual period of time covered is December 31, 1978 through December 29, 1979, or 52 standard report weeks (defined as Sunday through Saturday). The data may differ somewhat from the cumulative totals published in "Texas Morbidity This Week," Week #52, 1979. The addition of delayed reports, removal of duplicate reports, and/or other corrections made to the morbidity files account for any differences in the published figures.

The methods for collecting morbidity data during 1979 were similar to those of prior years so that the data may be compared to that of previous years. During 1979, however, the data were supplemented by the inclusion of laboratory results provided by the Texas Department of Health's Bureau of Laboratories. The effects the inclusion of laboratory data may reflect have been considered in the analysis'. A more timely review of disease reports received through the weekly morbidity reporting system has assisted in the detection of unusual occurrences of disease throughout the state.

Beginning with Week #1, 1979, only cases diagnosed as either primary or secondary syphilis were tabulated in "Texas Morbidity This Week." Cumulative syphilis totals from previous years have been adjusted to reflect the change in publication format which omits all other stages of the disease.

The data contained in this summary reflects only reports of the notifiable diseases which occurred in Texas residents. Cases of notifiable diseases which occurred in non-U.S. residents (i.e. aliens) whose illnesses were diagnosed in Texas are listed in Table I. The Texas Department of Health participates in an interstate reciprocal notification of disease system which allows for the reporting of out-of-state residents diagnosed in Texas to the appropriate state health departments for investigative and reporting purposes. Cases referred through this reporting system are not included in this summary.

CURRENT TRENDS IN REPORTABLE DISEASES

While significant increases in the numbers of reported cases of various diseases were noted in 1979, no cases of the following diseases were reported in Texas residents last year:

Anthrax	Plague
Cholera	Poliomyelitis, paralytic
Diphtheria	Smallpox
Western equine encephalitis	Epidemic typhus
Venezuelan equine encephalitis	Yellow fever

Reported cases of endemic typhus (murine typhus) increased substantially from 33 cases in 1978 to 59 cases in 1979, the greatest number reported in Texas since 1954. Nine counties

in the lower Rio Grande Valley accounted for 90% (53 cases) of the 1979 cases.

The increase in reported cases of amebiasis, salmonellosis, and shigellosis in 1979 is due in part to the inclusion of cases detected through reviews of the Texas Department of Health laboratory results of persons who had not previously been reported.

Reported cases of typhoid fever in Texas residents increased 67.5%, from 40 cases recorded in 1978 to 67 cases in 1979. Infections acquired outside the United States accounted for 56.7% of the 1979 typhoid fever cases in Texas.

Five cases of St. Louis encephalitis (SLE) accounted for the only arboviral activity in Texas residents during 1979. The five SLE cases were the first arboviral cases reported in the state since seven Western equine encephalitis cases and nine SLE cases were recorded in 1977.

A significant increase in the incidence of tick-borne relapsing fever was also noted during 1979 with eight cases having been reported. This was the highest number of cases in Texas since 1957.

Preparations are currently underway for Reported Morbidity and Mortality in Texas - 1979 Annual Summary. This publication will provide additional epidemiologic descriptions of communicable disease activity in Texas, incidence rates, mortality data, and an overview of special surveillance activities conducted by the Epidemiology Division.
