Unless they meet the case reporting criteria, they are not counted as a case for official reporting purposes and are not included in the "Total" column.






Figure 2. WNV-Positive Mosquito Pools Reported in Texas, by MMWR Week of collection, 2017-2019




Figure 3. Human Cases of West Nile Virus Reported in Texas, by MMWR Week of Onset, 2017-2019
