



## Kindergarten-12th Grade Provisional Enrollment Vaccine Dosing Schedule

If a student is provisionally enrolled, a school nurse or administrator shall review the immunization status of a provisionally enrolled student every 30 days to ensure continued compliance in completing the required doses of vaccine(s).

If a student's immunization record indicates that **the student has received at least one dose of each specific age-appropriate vaccine**, the following provisional enrollment vaccine dosing schedule is applicable. The schedule is based on the [ACIP Catch-Up Schedule](#). The spacing of doses only applies to doses received after the student's provisional enrollment begins.

Vaccine	Dose	Interval Between Subsequent Dose(s)
DTaP (student <7 yrs)	2 <sup>nd</sup>	4 weeks
DTaP (student <7 yrs)	3 <sup>rd</sup>	4 weeks
DTaP (student <7 yrs)	4 <sup>th</sup> (final)	6 months
Hepatitis A	2 <sup>nd</sup> (final)	6 months
Hepatitis B	2 <sup>nd</sup> *	4 weeks
Hepatitis B	3 <sup>rd</sup> (final)	8 weeks after 2nd dose and 16 weeks after 1st dose
MMR**	2 <sup>nd</sup> (final)	4 weeks
Polio	2 <sup>nd</sup>	4 weeks
Polio	3 <sup>rd</sup> (final)	6 months
Varicella (student <13 years) **	2 <sup>nd</sup> (final)	3 months
Varicella (student 13+ years) **	2 <sup>nd</sup> (final)	4 weeks

\*For students aged 11 - 15 years, 2 doses meet the requirement if adult hepatitis B vaccine (Recombivax®) was received. Dosage (10 mcg/1.0mL) and type of vaccine (Recombivax®) must be clearly documented. If Recombivax® was not the vaccine received, a 3-dose series is required.

\*\* MMR and varicella vaccines must be given at least 28 days apart if they are not given on the same day. That may affect the spacing of these vaccines. Students that are due for the MMR or varicella vaccine but have received the other vaccine within the past 28 days can be provisionally enrolled until the 28 days have passed.

If a student is aged 7 years and older and **hasn't received any doses** of DTaP, the following applies.

Vaccine	Dose	Interval Between Subsequent Dose(s)
Tdap*	1 <sup>st</sup>	
Td	2 <sup>nd</sup>	1 month
Td	3 <sup>rd</sup>	6 months

\* One of the doses must be Tdap to comply with school rules, but if Td is administered first, the spacing of doses still applies.

If a student is aged 7 years and older and has received **at least 1 required dose** of DTaP, the student should complete the primary DTaP / DT / Tdap / Td series and one of the doses should be Tdap to stay enrolled in school.

Td/Tdap	2 <sup>nd</sup>	4 weeks
Td/Tdap	3 <sup>rd</sup>	4 weeks

1 <sup>st</sup> Dose of DTaP/DT/Tdap/Td Received On or After 1 <sup>st</sup> Birthday		
Vaccine	Dose	Interval Between Subsequent Dose(s)
Td/Tdap	2 <sup>nd</sup>	4 weeks
Td/Tdap	3 <sup>rd</sup> (final)	6 months

**Please note there is no provisional enrollment for Tdap (unless it is used to replace primary DTaP series).**
