- Understand how to manage and address rejected notifications in the Rejected Notifications Queue.

### **Notifications Overview**

NEDSS uses notifications to report TB cases to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). At the local and regional levels, submitted notifications alert the DSHS TB Unit's surveillance team of a case that is ready for review.

### **Create Notification: Missing Data**

NEDSS conducts a check to make sure all required fields (marked with an asterisk) are completed. If a field is blank, the system will alert the user of the missing data field. The Edit button can be used to open the investigation and update the missing information. The notification can then be resubmitted.

1) The case will be **approved** by the TB Unit surveillance case consultant and submitted to CDC.



2) The case will be **rejected**, the user will be notified of the reason and will need to re-submit the notification.

### **Frequency of Monitoring this Queue**

### **R/LHDs should monitor this queue DAILY for:**

- Status of cases submitted to the TB Unit
- Users must respond to a rejected notification before the state case number can be assigned
