# Agenda Item 1: Call to order, welcome, vice-chair remarks, meeting logistics, and roll call

Ms. Shannon Harvill, Vice-Chair, convened the TFBHO meeting at 1:01 p.m., and welcomed attendees. Ms. Francesca Kupper, Program Specialist, Advisory Committee Coordination Office (ACCO), Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC), provided logistical announcements, conducted the roll call, and noted a quorum was present.

**Agenda Item 2:** Consideration of August 13, 2025, draft meeting minutes

Ms. Harvill called for any edits or changes to the August 13, 2025, draft meeting minutes.

Receiving no edits or changes, Ms. Harvill called for a motion to approve the draft.

#### **MOTION:**

Dr. Richard Chamberlain moved to approve the August 13, 2025, draft meeting minutes as written. Ms. Dairen Sarmiento Rangel seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved with no nays nor abstentions.

#### Agenda Item 3: Texas A&M H5N1 Project

Dr. David I. Douphrate, Associate Professor of Environmental and Occupational Health, and Dr. Anabel Rodriguez, Assistant Professor of Environmental & Occupational Health, both from Texas A&M University School of Public Health, reviewed the PPT titled, "Avian Influenza on Dairy Farms in the U.S.-The Human Impact in a Challenging Working Environment". Highlights included:

- Agriculture, poultry and fishing represents the industry with the highest fatality and injury rates out of all industrial sectors in the U.S.
- Since it was detected in Texas on March 25, 2024, H5N1 has been spreading to other U.S. states.
- Texas A&M University researchers are waiting for confirmation on the specimen results for the samples collected from farm workers.

## Agenda Item 4: New World Screwworm

Dr. Susan Rollo, State Public Health Veterinarian, DSHS, reviewed the PPT titled, "New World Screwworm". Highlights included:

- To protect the U.S. border, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has increased the number of tick riders to look for stray cattle. At least 100 traps were installed to analyze suspected flies.
- Different state agencies at different levels are working to create awareness and educate the public about new world screwworm.
- USDA staff related to this response are continuing to work through the current government shutdown.

#### Agenda Item 5: Recommendations report process

Mr. Guillermo Zenizo Lindsey, Binational Communications Coordinator, Office of Border Public Health, DSHS, reviewed the PPT titled, "2025-2026 Recommendations Process" sharing general guidance about the TFBHO recommendations report to be prepared by members by November 1, 2026. Members provided a variety of topics of interest to be discussed at upcoming meetings.
