

TFBHO Next Steps Discussions

Suggested topics of discussion:

- Scope of the Border Region Data
 - Texas Health and Safety Code: 16 counties immediately adjacent to the international boundary
 - La Paz Agreement of 1983: 32 counties within 62 miles of the international boundary
- Adjustment to Bylaws
 - Counting/not counting ex-officio for quorum.
- How do we move forward to be valuable for all members?
 - Topics to address, following up recommendations, next areas of focus.

Adjustment to TFBHO Bylaws

Counting ex-officio members for quorum.

- Being considered by default:
 A quorum of a public body is a majority of the number of members fixed by statute. Texas Government Code § 311.013(b)
- An advisory committee's rules or bylaws can state that ex-officio nonvoting members are not counted when determining whether a quorum is present: "Quorum" means a majority of a governmental body, unless defined differently by applicable law or rule or the charter of the governmental body. Texas Government Code § 551.001(6)
