Since September 2009, Knapp Medical Center has distributed more than 900 infant and booster seats to indigent families. To be eligible for a car seat, the parent must receive training on proper car seat installation and how to correctly fit child harnesses. Knapp offers this training free-of-charge, as well as free childbirth education classes for expectant parents. To promote wellness and cancer prevention / early intervention among the adult population, Knapp Medical Center held a free health talk on ¿Colon Cancer Screening & Prevention¿ in To address the COVID pandemic, Knapp Medical Center hosted vaccine clinics which were provided for the community by the City of Weslaco. More than 10,000 people received the vaccine through weekly clinics held at the Knapp Medical Center Conference Center. To address a shortage of blood, Knapp Medical Center held a blood drive in July 2021. The Knapp Volunteer Program assists students needing volunteer hours to gain volunteer experience in a healthcare setting, and provides opportunities for older adults who enjoy volunteering and feel a sense of purpose in doing so. In addition, the Knapp Medical Center Volunteer Auxiliary provides a culturally-sensitive chart for dieticians to use in teaching diabetes and renal failure patients about portion control and meal planning. The chart uses visual cues to food choices rather than words. The charts provide a valuable educational resource, especially for the area's Hispanic population which is at greater risk for developing diabetes.
