Goal is to screen 75,000 community-dwelling Medicare and Medicaid beneficiaries residing in Bexar County per year for 5-yrs. SITES: Harlendale ISD, South San Antonio, Edgewood ISD Behavior and Psych Sitter Program: This accounts for the time associates spent in a 1:1 with suicidal and behavioral holds. As the CHRISTUS Santa Rosa facilities do not provide these services we must hold them until proper treatment becomes available. Diabetes Education Provided Diabetes and meal planning information for lectures during individual appointments, adults, and gestational classes. These classes are open to the general public and are free of charge. Westover Hills and San Marcos Free Sports Clinic The Free Sports clinic is open to the public every weekend. There are not charges for the patients and all associates are volunteering their time. This entry also captures the free athletic training services we provide to the local community.
