




In 2019, there were 5,854 actively licensed chiropractors in Texas.

- This number represented a 11.8% increase since 2014 and a 27.5% increase since 2009.
- Relative to population growth, the size of the chiropractor workforce has improved by 7.9% over the past 10 years.



- In 2019, 30.4% of active chiropractors were women, and 69.6% were men
- In 2010, 24.4% of active chiropractors were women, and 75.6% were men

Chiropractors were not evenly distributed throughout the state.

- There was a 55.9% difference between the number of chiropractors in metropolitan and non-metropolitan areas even after controlling for population differences.
- Between border and non-border areas, the percent difference was 102.4%.
