


In 2019, there were 27,345 actively licensed massage therapists providing care in Texas.

■ This number represented a 3.1\% increase since 2014 and a $10.8 \%$ increase since 2009 .

- Relative to population growth, the size of the massage therapist workforce has declined by $5.9 \%$ over the past 10 years.
- Texas had fewer massage therapists than the national average.

Within 10 years, $25.9 \%$ of the current Texas massage therapist workforce will be eligible for retirement.

■ 7.3\% of active massage therapists in Texas were older than 65 years of age in 2019.

- $37.3 \%$ were 40 years of age or younger.

Massage therapists were not evenly distributed throughout the state.

■ There was a $54.4 \%$ difference between the number of massage therapists in metropolitan and nonmetropolitan areas even after controlling for population differences.

- Between border and non-border areas, the percent difference was $62.3 \%$.
