Licensed Psychologist Growth Trends

This fact sheet is an overview of the trends, distribution, and demographics of licensed psychologists in Texas. In 2020, there were 4,823 actively licensed psychologists in Texas.

- This number represented a 11.0% increase since 2015 and a 27.0% increase since 2010.
- Relative to population growth, the size of the licensed psychologist workforce has improved by 7.9% over the past 10 years.

Despite these improvements, Texas still had fewer licensed psychologists per capita than the national average.

Figure 1. Total Licensed Psychologists¹





Figure 2. Ratio of Population to Licensed Psychologist

Figure 3. Ratio of Texas Population to Licensed Psychologist by County



Licensed psychologists were not evenly distributed throughout the state.

- Per capita, metropolitan counties had 3.8 times as many licensed psychologists as non-metropolitan counties.
- Per capita, non-border counties had 4.0 times as many licensed psychologists as border counties.



Demographics of Licensed Psychologists

Race/Ethnicity of Licensed Psychologists

Black/African American and Hispanic/Latino licensed psychologists were underrepresented when compared to the Texas population.²

Figure 4. Race/Ethnicity of Texas Population and Licensed Psychologists



Age Distribution of Licensed Psychologists by Race/Ethnicity

- 43.2% of white/Caucasian licensed psychologists were 61 years of age or over, while 17.1% were aged 40 years or under.
- 35.3% of black/African American licensed psychologists were between 41 and 50 years of age, and 35.3% were aged 40 years or under.
- 30.0% of Hispanic/Latino licensed psychologists were between 41 and 50 years of age, and 31.1% were aged 40 years or under.

Gender of Licensed Psychologists

- In 2020, 66.4% of licensed psychologists were female and 33.6% were male.³
- In 2010, 56.4% were female and 43.6% were male.
- Among licensed psychologists aged 40 years or under in 2020, 82.8% were female and 17.2% were male.

Age Distribution of Licensed Psychologists by Gender

Within 10 years, 43.9% of the current Texas licensed psychologist workforce will be over 65 years of age.⁴

- 26.4% of active licensed psychologists in Texas were over 65 years of age in 2020.
- Among licensed psychologists over 55 years of age, males comprised 47.8% of the workforce.


