### **Respiratory Care Practitioners Growth Trends**


This fact sheet is an overview of the trends, distribution, and demographics of respiratory care practitioners (RCPs) in Texas. In 2022, there were 13,817 actively licensed RCPs in Texas.

- This number represented a 0.2% increase since 2017 and a 5.6% increase since 2012 (Figure 1).
- The ratio of the Texas population per one RCP in 2012 was 1,998:1 and in 2022 it was 2,220:1. The ratio of population to RCP has increased by 11.1% (Figure 2).¹

Figure 3. Ratio of Texas Population to RCP by County<sup>1</sup>



- The ratio of the Texas population to one RCP was higher in non-metropolitan counties compared to metropolitan counties.
- The ratio of the Texas population to one RCP was higher in non-border counties compared to border counties.
- 50 counties had no RCPs (Figure 3).



### **Demographics of Respiratory Care Practitioners**

#### Race/Ethnicity


Figure 4. Race/Ethnicity of Texas Population and RCPs<sup>2</sup>

Hispanic/Latino RCPs were underrepresented when compared to the Texas population (Figure 4).<sup>2</sup> Race/ ethnicity data were available for 12,517 of 13,817 RCPs (90.6%).

#### Age Distribution by Race/Ethnicity


Figure 5. Age Distribution of RCPs by Race/Ethnicity

- 18.1% of White/Caucasian RCPs were 61 years of age or over, while 27.9% were aged 40 years or under (Figure 5).
- 33.1% of Black/African American RCPs were between 41 and 50 years of age, and 29.5% were aged 40 years or under (Figure 5).
- 27.3% of Hispanic/Latino RCPs were between 41 and 50 years of age, and 44.9% were aged 40 years or under (Figure 5).

## **Employment Characteristics of Respiratory Care Practitioners**

- As seen in Figure 6, 50.7% of RCPs reported practicing for 20 to 39 hours hours.
- 40.9% of RCPs reported practicing for 40 or more hours.
- Primary practice hours data were available for 11,080 of 13,817 RCPs (80.2%).

- In 2022, the top three primary practice settings for RCPs were hospital based setting (83.9%), an "other" setting (6.6%), and direct (5.2%).
- Primary practice setting data were available for 10,821 of 13,817 RCPs (78.3%).
