Capability 1: Community Preparedness

- Determine risks to health
- Strengthen community partnerships
- Coordinate and share information
- Coordinate training
- Support community involvement

 - ▶ K-9




Capability 5: Fatality Management

- Determine agency role in fatality management
- Facilitate access to resources
- Assist in data collection and dissemination
- Support provision of survivor mental health services
- Support processing and storage operations

Function 4: Survivor Mental Health Services

- LMHA and LBHA response
- Crisis Counseling Program (CCP) Grants
 - ► Example: CCP TX-4781
- Specialized Recovery Grants
 - Example: Sustainable, Technical Assistance, Training and Engagement Grant



Capability 7: Mass Care

- Determine role in mass care operations
- Determine mass care needs
- Coordinate public health, health care and behavioral health needs
- Monitor mass care population health



Function 3: Coordinate Behavioral Health Needs

- Situation Reports
- State of Texas Assistance Requests
- Grant management:
 - Fiscal and data monitoring
 - Program oversight



State of Texas Assistance Requests (STARs)

STARs requirements:

- Requestor Information
- Item/Mission Description Requested: (Item/mission, quantity, unit, date needed, for how long, mission description, purpose of request)
- Delivery Address
- Point of Contact
- Responsible Party



State of Texas Assistance Requests (STARs)

STARs may be used for:

- COOP Respite for LMHAs and LBHAs
- Peer or Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) for on-site first responders
- Peer, CISM, or Family Assistance Centers for local area hospital staff depending on the scope and scale of the disaster
