Consumable hemp products (CHPs)

To conduct the sale, service, or delivery of a CHP, you must have an appropriate license or registration issued by the Texas Department of State Health Services.

Each time you conduct the sale, service, or delivery of a CHP, you must:

- 1. Ask to see the person's ID.
- 2. Carefully inspect the person's ID and verify that it:
 - ☐ Is issued by a government agency (e.g., driver's license, passport, military ID).
 - ☐ Is unexpired.
 - Includes a physical description and photo consistent with the person's appearance.
 - Appears to be valid.
 - ☐ Shows the person is 21 or older.
- If all the above requirements are met, you may conduct the transaction.

Failure to comply with these requirements is a violation of state law and regulations.

Some examples of CHPs are:

- Cannabidiol (CBD) or tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) oil.
- CBD or THC gummies.
- Food and drinks infused with CBD or THC.

Consumable hemp products (CHPs)

A CHP is a product processed or manufactured for consumption that contains hemp, including food, a drug, a device and a cosmetic. It does not include any consumable hemp product containing a hemp seed, or hemp seed-derived ingredient used in a manner generally recognized as safe by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.
