

2012 Texas School Immunization Validation Survey Results

Retrospective Vaccination Coverage Rates of Kindergarten Students Attending Public Schools in Texas

The purpose of the 2012 Texas School Immunization Validation Survey was to assess the number of kindergarten students that were appropriately vaccinated in accordance with Texas school entry immunization requirements (Title 25 Health Services, Chapter 97, Texas Administrative Code §97.63). The Texas Education Agency reported that there were approximately 390,528 kindergarten students enrolled at approximately 4,300 Texas public schools during the 2012 – 2013 school year.

For the Texas School Immunization Validation Survey, a cluster sampling method was used to select 45 schools with kindergarten students. A random sample of 100 immunization records of kindergarten students was selected from each school.

The following table presents Texas statewide vaccination coverage rates for kindergarten students attending public school in Texas, retrospectively measured at 24 months of age.
