# **EMS Response to Traffic Incidents\***

Texas Trends between 2019 and 2022



Between **2019** and **2022**, traffic-related responses **increased** by **12,359**.

Texas averaged
756 traffic-related
responses
per day and
31 per hour.

### **Drug and Alcohol Use in Traffic-Related Responses**

On average, Texas recorded **7,969** indications of alcohol or drug use in traffic-related responses annually.



Drug and alcohol use in traffic-related responses increased by 26%.

### **Response Time Disparities**



In rural areas, **eight minutes** elapsed from **dispatch to arrival on scene** and **42 minutes** elapsed from **dispatch to patient arrival at destination**.







In urban areas, six minutes elapsed from dispatch to arrival on scene and 38 minutes elapsed from dispatch to patient arrival at destination.



45% Male






46% Female

#### **Traffic-Related Responses by Race and Ethnicity**



In 2022, the highest percentage of traffic-related responses occurred among Hispanic Latinos, followed by non-Hispanic whites and non-Hispanic Blacks.

### **Traffic-Related Responses by Age**

32% of traffic-related responses involved people between the ages of 25 and 44.



**13%** of traffic-related responses involved children **under 18**.
