### **Brief Description**

The purpose of this practicum is to provide students with the opportunity to apply public health knowledge to inform maternal child health practice in the community. Data collected would serve as a baseline for promoting optimal health and healthy development across the lifespan in the region. Learning objectives include (1) explore Title V maternal child health performance measures for perinatal specific guidance, (2) analyze Texas legal and regulatory and institutional policies intended to protect infant health and inform public health practice, (3) gain experience researching and reviewing health policies, plans and statutes.

Review perinatal health policies to understand and analyze what infant-serving institutions are doing to promote perinatal health.

- Identify at least one perinatal Title V measure focus area for policy analysis (e.g., safe sleep, etc.)
- Conduct an environmental scan of perinatal health policies in the US
- Review current Texas legislature informing perinatal care and best practices
- Describe health policy processes and structures
- Compare perinatal policies in Texas

#### **Intern Deliverables**

• Summary of intern activities can include:

- Environmental scan for opportunities and trends that may impact the current and future perinatal care strategies
- Perinatal /MCH-related updates from the 88th Legislative Session with recommendations for public health practice and potential MCH outcomes
- Perinatal policy analysis
