### Alzheimer's Disease Program

#### **History**

Established in 1987

#### **Purpose**

- Increase awareness of Alzheimer's disease
- Address burden of living with condition and providing care
- Support Texas Council on Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders
- Work with the Texas Alzheimer's Disease Partnership

#### **Funding**

- ~\$80,000 annually (GR Funds)
- 1 FTE

### **Program Activities**

- Education and Referral
- Support the Council in developing its biennial legislative report
- Serve on the Aging Texas Well Advisory Committee

### **Recent Developments**

 Program transferred to Community Health Improvement Division within DSHS



# Texas Council on Alzheimer's & Related Disorders

### **History and Membership**

- Established in 1987
- Membership
  - 12 Voting Members appointed by the Governor, Lt. Governor, Speaker of the House, including:
    - 5 Professional Members
    - 7 Public Members
  - Non-voting members representing the Texas Health and Human Services System
- Recent Developments
  - New Chair appointed in February 2018
  - 8 new members appointed since December 2017



# Texas Council on Alzheimer's & Related Disorders

## The Council's Functions are Driven by Two Statutes

Health and Safety Code, Chapter 101 (created in 1987):

- Make recommendations
- Coordinate networking systems for families and caregivers
- Disseminate information on services/activities
- Facilitate state agency services coordination
- Encourage research
- Submit a biennial legislative report

Education Code, Chapter 154 (created in 1999):

- Establish the Texas Alzheimer's Research and Care Consortium (TARCC)
- Provide funds to TARCC participants to develop clinical centers



# Texas Alzheimer's Disease Partnership

## Volunteer Network Committed to a State Plan for Alzheimer's

- Established in 1999
- Assisted in authoring and implementing the 2010-2015 Texas Alzheimer's Disease State Plan, covering:
  - Overview of the State of Alzheimer's in Texas
  - Strategies of Addressing Key Areas of Concern:
    - Science
    - Prevention & Brain Health
    - Disease Management
    - Caregiving/Caregivers
    - Infrastructure
- An updated State Plan is in development
  - DSHS will be reaching out to Partnership members and the Council in developing new State Plan
  - State Plan not currently required in statute



# **Next Steps**

- Train new council members on both Health and Safety and Education Code tasks through coordination with UT-Austin, UT-Southwestern, etc.
- Encourage Council to meet more frequently to establish cohesive recommendations for required legislative report and conduct Consortium duties
  - Statute requires the Council to meet at least twice annually
- Establish timeline for coordinating State Plan efforts with the Partnership and Council
