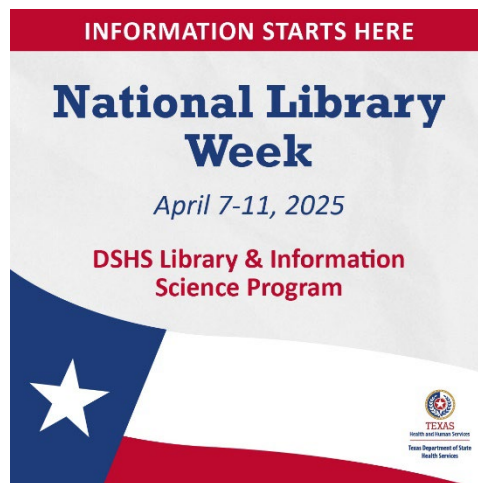


National Library Week 2025 Webinars
