

Prescription Drug Donation Program

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: I have completed the Drug Donation Program Donor Form. What are the next steps for donating the medication?

A: After completing the [Prescription Drug Donation Donor Form](#), refer to the link on the webpage

Q: Are there only specific medications that can or cannot be donate?

A: While medications may not be listed by name, the home page of the Drug Donation Program website provides a list of what medications you can donate, along with what you cannot donate and why. The web page includes images to help you. If you still cannot decide if your medication qualifies, please [contact us](#) or the participating pharmacy that will receive your donation.

Q: Is there a prescription drug donation provider in my area?

A: You can find a list of participating providers where you can donate your medications at [Prescription Drug Donation Program Participating Provider Database](#).

Q: How do I send the medications I want to donate?

A: First, you contact one of the participating providers, which you can find on the [Prescription Drug Donation Program Participating Provider Database](#). Then, complete the [Prescription Drug Donation Program Donor Form](#). Finally, coordinate with the provider site to see how they would like to receive the medications you plan to donate.

Q: I would like to know if a medication prescribed to me has been donated. If I qualify to receive it, what do I do?

A: To know if a medication you need was donated, contact the listed participating providers. Each location has different medications they accepted on hand. If the participating provider does have a medication you were prescribed, they will provide you with instructions to receive the donated medication.

Q: What is the mailing address for donating medications?

A: The address for donating medications varies based on the participating provider that agreed to accept your donation. You will need to coordinate with that provider to receive their mailing address.
