

- Accumulated rubbish
- Abandoned vehicles and appliances
- Tires
- Mosquitoes and conditions leading to mosquito breeding
- High weeds
- Other unsanitary conditions

The Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) oversees health and safety conditions at DSHS-licensed youth camps in Texas. All DSHS-qualifying youth camps must obtain a license before operating. Any youth camp may be inspected to ensure compliance with the Youth Camp Safety and Health Act and the Youth Camp Rules.
