Region 8 Activities

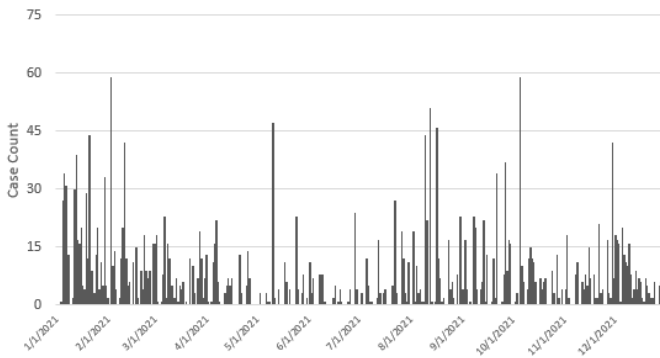
- Serve on the Pearsall and Dilley ISD School Health Advisory Committees

Immunizations

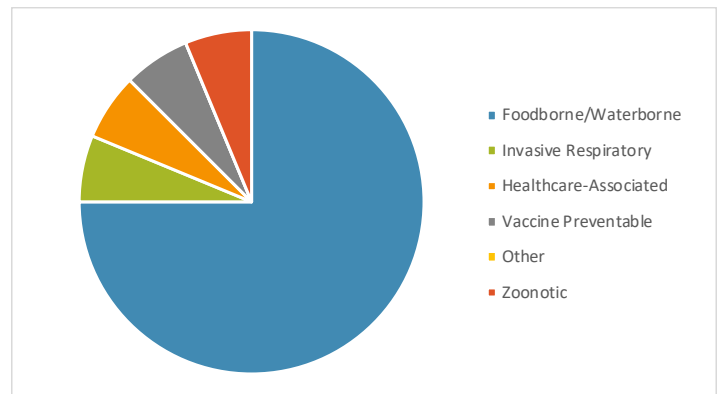
- The percent of school students with a conscientious exemption from immunizations filed at the school district level in Frio County is 0.42% up from 0.27% in 2020

2021 Public Health by the Numbers
