## Region 8 Activities

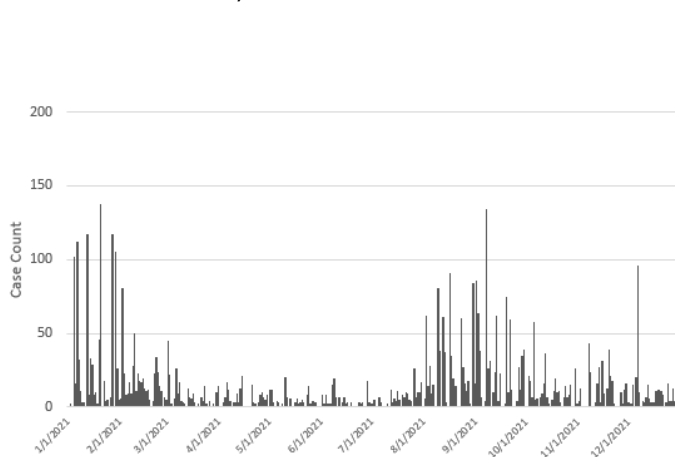
- Provide COVID-19 vaccinations at community-based clinics
- Serve on the Region 8 COVID-19 Immunizations Task Force
- Distribute, install and inspect child car seats and provide safety education to parents and guardians
- Conduct radKIDS (resisting aggression defensively) classes to help children deal with bullying and avoid physical and/or sexual abuse
- Educate the community about hyperthermia (over-heating) prevention, handwashing, sun and water safety, pedestrian safety, and alcohol and substance abuse prevention
- Promote the use of ImmTrac2, the Texas Immunization Registry for children and adults
- Organize the Wilson-Atascosaa Child Fatality Review Team to review child deaths and recommend prevention strategies
- Be a resource for businesses, schools, childcare facilities and health care providers for COVID-19 precautions and reporting

## Immunizations

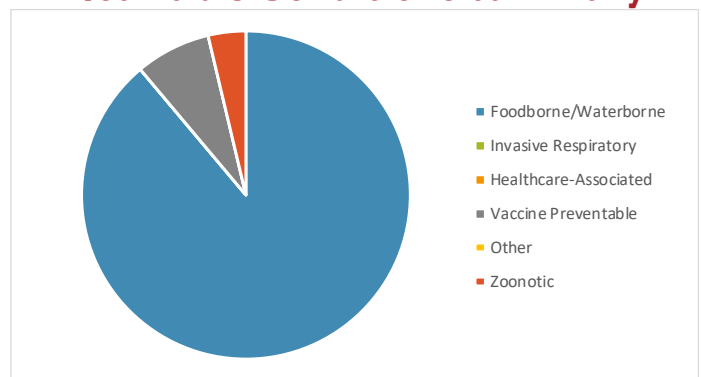
- The percent of school students with a conscientious exemption from immunizations filed at the school district level in Wilson County is 0.92% down from 1.79% in 2020
