Submersion Data, 2019

• Chapter 92, Sec. 92.002 of Health and Safety Code states submersion injuries are reportable to the department.

- Texas Administrative Code Title 25, Part 1
 - Submersion injury: the process of experiencing respiratory impairment from submersion/immersion in liquid.
 - EMS providers, hospitals, Justice of the Peace, Medical Examiners and Physicians are responsible for reporting submersion injuries.







Unspecified effects of drowning and nonfatal submersion	T75.1	106	24.15
Unspecified effects of drowning and nonfatal submersion, initial encounter	T75.1X XA	98	22.32
Accidental drowning and submersion while in swimming-pool, initial encounter	W67.X XXA	93	21.18

Submersion Registry Changes

New Submersion Models

- For Hospital reference only: ICD-10 external cause codes related to drownings and near drownings will be recorded.
- For Justice of the Peace /Medical Examiner reference only: How injury occurred, cause of death and submersion manner of death will be recorded.



New Submersion Models

- For Hospital reference only: Code examples, W16.211A, W67.XXXA, W67.XXXA.
- For Justice of the Peace (JP)/Medical Examiner (ME) reference only: Examples "how injury occurred" (fall, other, MVC), "cause of death" (drowning, blunt force head trauma), "submersion manner of death" (accidental, undetermined).



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- New Submersion Models for Hospitals, Justices of the Peace and Medical Examiners.
- Provider Name (entity) field is mandatory.
- Individual's home address field has been deleted.
- Hospital Arrival Date changed to ED/Hospital Arrival Date.
- ED Discharge Date field has been deleted.
- Hospital Discharge Date changed to ED/Hospital Discharge Date.
- Hospital Discharge Disposition changed to ED/Hospital Discharge Disposition.
- Patient activity additional answer choice not swimming/playing wandered out added.



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- Personal flotation device additional answer choices of "life jacket/puddle jumper (coast guard approved)" and "life jacket/puddle jumper (unknown approval)" added.
- Supervised additional answer choices added ex. "Yes, adult within arms reach" and "No, adult supervision..."
- ICD-10-CM Cause Code changed to accept submersion related ICD-10-CM external cause codes only.
- New JP/ME fields: how injury occurred, cause of death and submersion manner of death.
- Outcome field is mandatory. Answer choices are morbidity, no morbidity and death.
