National Diabetes Month 2022

National Diabetes Month, celebrated in November, is an awareness month that encourages people to get educated about diabetes, find resources, and bring attention to diabetes in communities across the country. <u>The National Institute of</u> <u>Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Disease</u> has resources to teach people about diabetes, including tips to manage prediabetes and prevent diabetes. In addition, the Texas Department of State Health Services <u>Diabetes Prevention and Control Program</u> has Texas specific resources and guidelines for individuals living with diabetes and those that support them.

Funding Opportunities

Youth Garden Grant

Kids Gardening is accepting applications for the <u>2023 Youth Garden Grant</u>. The grant supports school and youth educational garden projects used to enhance the quality of life for youth and their communities. Fifty programs will be awarded \$500 and a shipment of gardening supplies. <u>Apply</u> by December 2, 2022.

Farm to School Grant

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) is accepting applications for their Farm to School Grant. Schools, farmers, and other organizations that help produce or serve meals to kids through USDA's child nutrition programs can apply. In 2023, USDA will award grants through a competitive process that provides bonus points to projects operated by and serving communities that are underserved, marginalized, or adversely affected by poverty and inequality. USDA invites all eligible and interested organizations to apply by January 6, 2023.

Elementary Educators' Guide to Container Gardening

Kids Gardening and Crescent Garden partnered to create the <u>Elementary Educators'</u> <u>Guide to Container Gardening</u>. It also contains ten ideas for creating engaging themed container gardens for kids, from a Salsa Garden to a Tea Garden or Sensory Garden.

Building Family Confidence in the COVID-19 Vaccine: Framing Strategies for School Nurses

The Frameworks Institute, in partnership with the National Association for School Nurses and the Institute for Educational Leadership has created the <u>Building Family</u> <u>Confidence in the Covid-19 Vaccine: Framing Strategies for School Nurses toolkit</u>. This toolkit offers evidence-based tips and techniques to support more productive conversations and communications about getting kids vaccinated. The resources in the toolkit can equip school nurses to build the confidence of families who have not yet vaccinated their children against COVID-19.

Pediatric Acute-Onset Neuropsychiatric Syndrome Resources

The Pediatric Acute-Onset Neuropsychiatric Syndrome (PANS) Advisory Council, in conjunction with the Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC), works to educate schools about this rare medical condition, which affects an estimated one to two percent of children.
