School Behavioral Threat Assessment Training

The Texas School Safety Center will hold virtual Behavioral Threat Assessment Trainings in February and March. This training was developed to meet <u>Senate Bill 11</u>, 86th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2019 requirements which mandate the implementation of behavioral threat assessment teams. This training provides a proactive, evidence-based approach for identifying individuals who may pose a threat. Participants will learn about interventions before a violent incident occurs. Fostering Post-Traumatic Growth after Parental Death from COVID-19

In April 2021, researchers estimated that nearly 40,000 children under the age of 18 years in the U.S. had lost a parent to COVID-19. Losing a parent is one of the most life-altering experiences for children and adolescents, especially when the death is unexpected. Without adequate counseling and support, these traumatic events can put children and adolescents at increased risk for future mental health crises, maladaptive coping, abuse, chronic diseases, and poverty. This full text article from the <u>Journal of Adolescent Health</u> provides recommendations for supporting young people through these experiences.

Start with Hello Virtual Training

Start with Hello is a program which teaches students to be more socially inclusive and connected to each other. The program offers activities and curricula for all ages and seeks to empower students to end social isolation. This training allows participants to begin the Start with Hello program cycle train students. Participants will learn to assess the impact of loneliness and isolation in school communities.
