Texas Youth Preparedness Council: Applications due April 15, 2022

The Texas Youth Preparedness Council (YPC) brings together youth leaders from across the state who are interested in emergency preparedness and making their communities more resilient during potential disasters. The council provides an opportunity for Texas high school students to enhance their knowledge of emergency preparedness. Participants will develop leadership skills that will help them address and support the needs of their communities. Each Council year begins on June 1 and ends May 31. All students are expected to complete at least one (1) self-selected youth emergency preparedness-related project in his or her community or region. Adolescent Immunization Action Week April 4-8, 2022

Adolescent Immunization Action Week is a call to action urging parents and healthcare providers to get adolescents up to date on recommended immunizations. PAX Good Behavior Game Virtual Training

The PAX Good Behavior Game is a school-based, classroom preventative intervention used by educators to teach self-regulation. PAX Good Behavior Game is a set of strategies for teachers to use throughout their day to build students' behavioral skills and stamina for focused attention and on-task behavior. Research by Johns Hopkins University has shown that students who received PAX Good Behavior Game are more likely to experience success in school and have significantly improved lifetime outcomes. Oliver Foundation Healthy Choices Grants

Texas Youth Preparedness Camp

The Texas School Safety Center (TxSSC) at Texas State University will award scholarships to teams of 10 individuals (9 youth and 1 adult) to attend the Texas Youth Preparedness Camp. Camp will take place June 12-16, 2022, at Texas State University in San Marcos, Texas. The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) curriculum educates individuals about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area. Participants will develop a project and acquire the leadership skills needed to address emergency preparedness in their schools and communities when they return home. Training includes basic disaster response skills such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Camp participants (including the adult team leader) will receive FEMA CERT Basic Training and a certificate of completion. Applications must be submitted by 5:00 pm April 15, 2022. Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) Learning Collaborative: Apply by April 6, 2022
