

Texas Cancer Registry Meaningful Use Information

The Texas Cancer Registry (TCR) is currently accepting information from Eligible Professionals (EPs) for cancer case reporting to central cancer registries for Meaningful Use (MU).

TCR is declaring readiness for Stage 3 MU measures and specifications the 2014 or 2015 Edition CEHRT beginning January 1, 2017. Please see the <u>DSHS Meaningful Use</u> webpage for additional details on DSHS' Declaration of Readiness for Stage 3 MU.

IMPORTANT!

In order to meet the cancer reporting measure for MU, you must use an EHR with the cancer reporting capabilities and standards of CEHRT 45 CFR 170.314 (f)(5) and (f)(6). **The TCR will not onboard providers whose EHR product does not meet the certification criteria for cancer reporting.** Please visit our informational **EHR Certification Criteria** page for instructions on determining if your EHR meets the certification criteria for cancer reporting or contact your vendor for more information.

In support of physician reporting and the Meaningful Use (MU) of electronic health records (EHRs), the TCR has implemented reporting from Certified Electronic Health Record Technology (CEHRT). The TCR recognizes the Implementation Guide for Ambulatory Healthcare Provider Reporting to Central Cancer Registries, Release 1.1, March 2014 (IG) as guidance for submitting data through HL7 for Meaningful Use. Submissions to TCR must meet specifications in CFR 170.314 (f)(5) and (f)(6) to be accepted. Reporting to the TCR is one way of demonstrating the meaningful use of CEHRT for <u>Eligible Professionals</u> (<u>EPs</u>) participating in the <u>Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services' EHR Incentive Payment Programs</u> (<u>Incentive Programs</u>). Eligible Hospital (EH) and Critical Access Hospital (CAH) program participants cannot select cancer reporting to the TCR as an option for meeting an Incentive Program objective.

Please Note: EHR reporting is not intended to replace traditional <u>cancer reporting from hospitals</u> and other facilities; it is meant to supplement existing reporting sources.

Beginning December 15, 2015, in order to meet EHR Incentive Program requirements, EPs must be "Actively Engaged" with a registry to attest positively to meeting the objective.

Three ways EPs are considered **Actively Engaged**:

- <u>Register their intent</u> to submit data to the registry within 60 days after the start of the reporting period. Once registered, EPs may be placed in a queue for testing/validation. EPs in the queue are considered Actively Engaged.
 - EPs that have registered in previously do not need to submit an additional registration to meet this requirement for each EHR reporting period.
 - Before registering with the TCR, be sure to visit the <u>DSHS Meaningful Use</u> webpage to view information on the updated MU regulations. The DSHS MU webpage also contains information on other Public Health Reporting options, including <u>Immunizations</u>, <u>Electronic Lab Reporting</u>, and <u>Syndromic Surveillance</u>.
- 2. The EP is in the process of testing and validation of the electronic submission of data. Once an EP has been invited to test by the TCR, they must respond promptly. Once testing criteria are passed, the EP will be moved into production.
- 3. Submitting data regularly into the production environment (ongoing submission).
