The fellow will be trained in the LBK community platform, will assist providers navigate the platform and work on one with local residents who need help accessing medical and/or social resources.

The fellow will have the opportunity to participate in community outreach activities, attend community meetings and support the onboarding of new providers. The fellow will have opportunities to learn about local public health services, engage with municipal government leaders, and travel to state level conferences and meetings.
