Fellow projects, responsibilities, activities, and/or deliverables: The Child and Adolescent Health Branch (CAHB) Fellow will design and implement a continuous quality improvement (CQI) framework to evaluate CAHB project efficiency, effectiveness, performance, accountability, outcomes, impacts, and other indicators of quality. The framework will inform CAHB programmatic protocols, structure, and reporting for all child, adolescent, and children and youth with special health care needs (CYSHCN) initiatives. The Fellow will conduct a literature review of public health CQI principles, best practices, frameworks, methods, resources, etc.; conduct a CAHB program/contract review (environmental scan) and gap analysis to identify inefficiencies and root causes; finalize the CQI project scope, draft a project charter, and coordinate the CQI project team; develop and implement improvement theory(ies), action plans and recommendations, evaluation protocols, standardized performance monitoring tools, and/or long-term sustainability plans; test CQI recommendations and action plans; develop standard operating procedures and train CAHB staff on process implementation; and draft a summary report of activities, findings, and any improvements measured. Opportunities to travel may be possible but will not be required.
