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**PRIMARY MISSION:** The Galveston County Health District serves the public health needs of the county

**DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT:** The goal of this project is to develop and execute interventions in communities with high social vulnerability indices high public health needs. The fellow will participate in an ongoing project to develop relationships and trust in areas identified through superimposition of surveillance data and SVI using GIS. This will allow for identification and engagement across a wide variety of public health domains including communicable and non-communicable diseases, environmental health, and mental health. The primary focus of this fellowship will be community outreach. The fellow will be expected to engage community leaders and key informants to develop strategies and interventions. The fellow will work with the Community Outreach Department to track interventions and to perform follow up evaluations on the effectiveness of these efforts. Receptiveness of these efforts will be evaluated through focus groups, non-structured and structured interviews, and surveys. Impact on outcomes will be determined by Support for tracking and data analysis will be provided by faculty from the University of Texas Medical Branch School of Public and Population Health. At the end of the fellowship, the fellow will deliver a report on their activities. This report will be able to form the basis for a scholarly paper or a dissertation.
