Texas Vital Statistics Section 2023 Five Star Criteria for Hospitals, Birthing Centers, and Midwives

To qualify for Five Star, your facility must have met ALL minimum criteria. To qualify for Exemplary Five Star, your facility must have met ALL exemplary criteria.

Training:

Attendance at either at the 2023 Summer Conference or the 2022 Annual Conference. Completion of Birth Registrar Certification (BRC).

Offices that attended both the Regional Conference and the Annual Conference will be considered for the Exemplary Five Star.

Customer Service:

Certified and released at least 96% of birth registrations no later than five days after the date of birth between 1/1/2023 and 9/30/2023.

Received the 2022 Office of Attorney General Award for Acknowledgment of Paternity.

Offices that certified and released 100% of birth registrations no later than five days after the date of birth will be considered for Exemplary Five Star.

Data Quality:

Legal: Filed amendments on less than 2% of all your facility's birth records between 1/1/2023 and 9/30/2023. This excludes paternity and adoption amendments.

Statistical: Marked "unknown" on a key required statistical field on less than 2% of all your facility's birth records between 1/1/2022 and 9/30/2022. These key fields are:

- Mother 1 Tab: Mother's Education
- Medical 1 Tab:
 - Date Last Normal Menses Began
 - o HIV Test Done Prenatally
 - HIV Test Done at Delivery
 - Attendant Type

Offices that filed less than 1% of records with legal amendments and less than 1% of records with a key statistical field marked "unknown" will be considered for Exemplary Five Star.

TxEVER Maintenance:

User to local administrator ratio: 20%; For every five users at a facility, there should be one local administrator.
